## September 26: Prague for 3 nights

Meet & greet private transfer from airport to hotel

Centrally located in Prague 1, Charles Bridge Palace is just 150 m from the famous Charles Bridge and a 10-minute walk to the Old Town Square. The hotel serves a rich buffet breakfast.

Elegantly decorated rooms are air-conditioned and come with a minibar, flat-screen TV with satellite channels and a marble tiled bathroom. Rooms overlook the Vltava River, Prague castle or hotel's secluded courtyard.

Wi-Fi is available throughout the Charles Bridge Palace and is free of charge. The hotel can organise rental cars, laundry services, tours and provides a concierge service.

Other attractions close by are the Wenceslas Square, 1 km away, the National Theatre, 1 tram stop away, and the Old Jewish Cemetery which is 400 m away. The Staroměstská Metro Station and a variety of restaurants and bars can be reached in a 5-minute walk. https://www.charlesbridgepalace.com/

#### Welcome dinner at Plzenska restaurant

Plzenska Restaurant in Prague is situated inside one of Europe's finest Art Nouveau buildings, the stunning Municipal House.

Plzenska Restaurant, named after the famous Czech beer Pilsner Urquell, presents classic Czech cuisine in a typical beer hall atmosphere.

As this is Municipal House, the interior of the restaurant is exquisite, with magnificent Art Nouveau features from the days of the First Republic, including ceramic mosaics, a golden clock and beautifully restored furniture by Sadílek. The decorative windows are all original.

The food at Plzenska is good, traditional Czech cuisine, prepared and presented with style. For a true taste of hearty Czech fare, we recommend the chef's specials like the Spicy Grilled Marinated Spare Ribs, the Roasted Pork Joint and the Bohemian Duck. The latter is served with typical red cabbage and dumplings.

There are other classic Czech dishes to choose from too, like smoked pork, sausages, goulash and fillet stroganoff, plus juicy wild boar medallions, brushed with cranberry sauce and served with potato pancakes - delicious!

## September 27

Prague Old and New Town at 9:30 am – walking tour - including the Jewish Quarter Duration about 3 hours

Your English speaking guide will take you on a walking tour of the **Prague Old and New Town**. You will see the **Wenceslas Square** with the equestrian statue of our patron saint **St. Wenceslas**, the "the **Church of our lady of the snows** - the tallest church in the city, the **Franciscan Garden**, the oldest building of the **Charles University** "**Karolinum**", founded in 1348, the **Old Town Square** with the statue of **Jan Hus** - our religious reformer, view the **Estates Theater** where **Mozart** performed his famous "Don Giovanni", the **Astronomical Clock** and go up the tower for a magnificent view - there is an elevator. Go through the **Jewish Quarter**, visiting the **Old New Synagogue**, the **Klaus**, **Spanish**, **Maisl** and **Pinkas** Synagogues and the **Old Jewish Cemetery**.

# September 28

**Private Walking Tour: Prague Castle Area** 

Duration of tour: 3 hours

You will walk through this Hradčany district visiting the **Loreta** the church with the **Casa Santa** and the **Black Madonna**, the **Strahov monastery** with it's famous baroque library, walk past the **Archbishops Palace** and other interesting areas along the way to the castle. This area was first settled in the ninth century and was the home of our kings and queens for many years. Now it houses the office of the president of the Czech Republic, several museums, and more. You will go inside the **St. Vitus Cathedral**, view the resting places of our **St. Wenceslas** and St. John of Nepomuk and admire the beauty of this grandiose cathedral. Then we go inside the **Royal Palace** where the, for its time unusually large, Wladislav Hall is located. It is 62 m long (186 feet), 16 m wide (48 feet) and 13 m high (39 feet) without any center support! Among other festive purposes, it is the inauguration hall of our presidents today.

#### 3 hour private foodie tour

This weekday walk will usually start by sampling regional specialties in a local *Greislerei*: a modern take on a dry-goods mercantile and delicatessen that offers everything from gourmet mustards and pestos to honey and cordials. The small-batch products, often organic and always high quality, are sourced primarily from local farms and focus on traditional methods and husbandry. Among the succulent canned fruits, jars of pickled vegetables, and bottles of fragrant oils and vinegars, you'll experience the ingredients that elevate Austrian cooking to world-class heights.

Our next visits vary from tour to tour depending on our appetites. Stops may include: a local cheese specialty shop to sample a variety of cheeses, from silky and mild to full and complex; savory snacks or sausages at a local cafe; a bakery for hearty breads or pastries; or a street food stand, to relish hearty favorites like *Leberkäse*—a type of sausage popular throughout Europe's German-speaking nations. While walking the sidewalks of Vienna, we'll develop a sense of the role that gastronomy plays in the everyday lives of Austrians and of the important relationship between a city and its gastronomic traditions.

We'll finish our sensory tour with a sweet treat in a local pastry shop or cafe, getting a glimpse of the cafe culture for which Vienna is known. It is not uncommon for patrons to buy a *Wiener Melange* - coffee with milk foam - and then simply spend the whole day in the coffeehouse. As gathering places for Vienna's intelligentsia, cafes have historically served as a mise en scene for political, artistic, and social movements. As our walk draws to a close, we'll consider the importance of these intellectual gathering places and how they provide a tableaux of Viennese *Gemütlichkeit* - that famed coziness.

At the end of this walk, we'll have a greater understanding of how the contemporary food scene in the city converges with tradition and how culinary craftsmanship has shaped the way of life—and we will have indulged in true Viennese fashion.

#### September 30

A hour private guided tour of Vienna with a bus and a guide and entrance fees included
First of all you drive along the famous Ring boulevard. Marvel at the impressive buildings in the style of
Historism constructed under Emperor Franz Josef, like the State Opera House, the Museum of Fine
Art, the Parliament, the City Hall, the Court Theatre and the University. On Heroe's Square you can
take pictures of the vast complex of the Imperial Palace. The former residence of the Habsburgs boasts
over 2.600 rooms!

Leaving the city center you get to the **Danube** area with the **United Nations buildings** and the **Danube Tower**. You also visit the nearby **Prater amusement park** with the world-famous **Giant Ferris Wheel**. On the way to the Schönbrunn Palace you pass other sights like the **City Park** with the famous golden **statue of Johann Strauss**, **St. Charles' church and** the **concert hall of the Musikverein**.

The visit of **Schoenbrunn Palace and grounds** (Unesco World Heritage) is another highlight of this tour. The former **summer residence of the Habsburgs** is Austria's number one tourist attraction. Take your time to marvel at the impressive palace and visit the amazing gardens. **Skip the line:** If you would like to include a private guided tour of the showrooms we will reserve your tickets in advance, so you don't have to wait in line.





#### October 1: Bratislava for 2 nights

2 hour private guided tour of Belvedere Museum with transportation and entrance fees included Meet your private, fully-licensed guide and let him take you through the highlights of the Belvedere Palace. These highlights include the paintings by Klimt, Schiele and many other Austrian and international artists, but also include some architectural and decoration details of the palace itself. Gustav Klimt and Egon Schiele being the two most famous 19th century Austrian painters, the majority of the focus will be on their masterpieces, such as Klimt's *The Kiss* and *Judith and the Head of Holofernes*, and Schiele's portraits. As you discover these major artworks, your guide will also introduce you to other fascinating curiosities and artists such as Franz Xaver Messerschmidt or Ferdinand Georg Waldmüller.

# Private transfer from Vienna to Bratislava with a 2 hour stop at Liechtenstein Castle and 1 hour guided tour.

But the intervening period saw the castle reach its full impressive extent and has remained a Liechtenstein property ever since. Under Prince Johann II it was reconstructed as a museum exhibiting sculptures and valuable reliefs from his collection. The architects were scrupulous in preserving and enhancing the castle's original Romanesque fabric, with such success that today it's regarded as one of the rarest and best-preserved examples of a secular Romanesque building in Europe. And for once one can believe the architectural hype. Great beamed ceilings, thick original walls, delicately capped towers, the ornamental variety of its highly elevated interior spaces divided by restful softly rounded arches, the sensuous drama of the castle's pillared main staircase. The castle's chapel is a particular delight, a consecrated, still-functioning space built by Liechtenstein's founder in 1130, with special significance thanks to a red chalk image, or 'sanguine,' depicting the Crucifixion with Mary and St John.

# Half day private guided tour to Bratislava

#### **Entrance fees to Bratislava castle and St Martin's cathedral included**

First you pay a visit to the newly-restored Bratislava Castle. Towering over the Danube river it is the city's emblem and offers postcard-views of Bratislava. Next to the castle you also see the parliament of Slovakia.

Afterwards you visit the lively old town below the castle. Your guide shows you the highlights, including Michael's Gate, the Slovak national theatre, the Academia Istropolitana, the old Town Hall and of course the cathedral of St. Martin. You also see the baroque Palffy palace, where Mozart performed at the age of six, as well as the de Pauli's palace. Franz Liszt gave his break-through concert there when he was only nine years old.

# Morning Half day private guided tour of Budapest Pest side (walking tour)

Walk through the Jewish Quarter, tracing the development of Jewish culture in the city from the Middle Ages to WW2 to the present. We'll discuss the vibrant Jewish community and the contemporary scene in the 7th district today as we visit the Great Synagogue (please note on Saturdays we will view from the exterior due to venue closures). We'll soak up the varying Pest architectural styles, from Art Nouveau to Baroque to the Neoclassical St. Stephen's Basilica. We will touch upon post-communist contemporary life in the city and discuss the future potential of this constantly modernizing hub.

Duration of tour: 1 hr 30 mins
